Governor's Council on Impaired Driving
May 1-3, 2007
Meeting Minutes

The quarterly meeting of the Governor's Council on Impaired Driving was held May 1-3, 2007 at the Parkway Plaza in Casper prior to and following the Governor's Conference on Impaired Driving. The meeting began with a welcome from Council Co-Chair Mary Frank. Members were updated on recent resignations (Diane Crosby, Steve Gilmore, Terry Rogers, Mark Norford and Janice Roman) and our newest members (Ted York and Lisa Laake) were introduced.

Lorrie Pozarik and Lisa Hillmer provided Council members with updates on registration, continuing education, and problem solving for the Governor's Conference including last minute changes in speakers. Members finalized plans for the conference and banquet registrations, and assigned roles for speaker introductions and for assisting the Governor with the awards. Council members broke into workshop teams to review final plans for their sessions, set up and test equipment, and complete last minute problem solving.

Most of the conference workshop speakers joined the Council for dinner.

The Governor's Conference on Impaired Driving was held on Wednesday, May 2, 2007; 153 people attended the entire conference and 249 people attended the awards banquet. Ten citizen awards and 101 DUI Enforcement Awards (the top 100 officers in the state) were presented by Governor Freudenthal.

The Governor's Council meeting resumed on Thursday morning following the conference. The Council agreed to conduct an Awards Banquet next year on Wednesday, May 7, 2008. A very long list of problems with the Parkway was reviewed and a discussion regarding where to hold the Awards Banquet next year ensued. There was general agreement regarding holding the event at a central location in the state and three options were identified: the Three Trails room at the Casper Events Center, the Best Western Inn in Lander, and the Holiday Inn in Casper. No consensus was reached. Council members decided to invite US Attorney Matt Mead and Attorney General Pat Crank to be the keynote speakers for the Awards Banquet.

Council members indicated their interest in a re-appointment and discussed potential appointees to replace those individuals who have opted not to be re-appointed.

Several topics were suggested for the August meeting agenda including a final decision regarding the location of the Awards Banquet, a presentation on South Dakota's elimination of their implied consent statute, a discussion about a comprehensive re-write of Wyoming's entire DUI statute or continuing to recommend improvements one section at a time, inviting legislators to use the Council as a resource when reviewing DUI legislation, and selecting priority areas for the Council for the next two years.

The next meeting of the Governor's Council will be held August 21-22, 2007 at the Best Western Inn in Lander.
